Condition	AAP Return to Care Recommendations	Health Visit
Cold symptoms	<ul> <li>Exclusion criteria (fever, behavior change) resolved</li> <li>Child can participate, AND staff can safely care for child</li> </ul>	Not required
Conjunctivitis	<ul> <li>Exclusion criteria (fever, behavior change) resolved</li> <li>Child can participate, AND staff can safely care for child</li> <li>Antibiotics NOT required</li> </ul>	Not required
Gastroenteritis	<ul> <li>Stool (nonbloody) contained by diaper (OK if loose) OR no dehydration more toileting accidents, AND fewer than 2 stools above normal frequency, AND/OR</li> <li>Vomiting resolved (if ≥2 episodes in 24 h)</li> <li>Child can participate, AND staff can safely care for child</li> </ul>	Only if blood or mucus in stool or dehydration
Fever	<ul> <li>Exclusion criteria (behavior change or other signs of illness) resolved, AND</li> <li>Child can participate, AND staff can safely care for child</li> </ul>	Not required unless < 4m age
Ringworm	<ul> <li>Exclusion criteria (behavior change or other signs of illness) resolved, AND</li> <li>Child can participate, AND staff can safely care for child</li> <li>Once treatment is started</li> </ul>	Only to initiate treatment
